

MOCK POLITICAL CONVENTION SCHEDULE
(Tentative)

Tuesday, April 20

- 2:00 P.M. - Convention parade through Lexington, finishing at the "convention hall" (Doremus Gymnasium). The parade will be made up of bands, floats, animals and "delegates".
- 3:00 P.M. - Convention called to order; Welcome to Lexington and Virginia by Judge Charles Glasgow, of Lexington; Keynote address by Representative Clarence Brown (R-Ohio), chairman of the executive committee of the Republican National Committee; Mr. Brown, as temporary convention chairman, will then call for committee reports; Election of permanent convention chairman; Report of Committee on Rules and Order of Procedure; Report of Committee on Resolutions (Platform); Debate on any planks of platform under question; Vote on platform. Adjourn about 5:30 p.m.
- 7:30 P.M. - Nominating speeches (These are usually accompanied by parades and demonstrations led by various state delegations backing respective candidates; Adjourn about 11:00 P.M.

Wednesday, April 21

- 9:30 A.M. - Continuation of nominations (if necessary); Balloting to choose presidential candidate; Balloting to choose vice-presidential candidate. Adjourn at 12:45 P.M.
- 2:00 P.M. - Continuation of balloting. Adjourn about 5:30 P.M.
- 7:30 P.M. - Continuation of balloting.

Balloting, in accordance with real convention procedure, will continue until the "nominees" are chosen. In 1940, for example, it took 17 ballots to choose the convention's GOP candidate for president. The length of sessions on April 21 cannot be forecast.
