


Foreword





THE CARNIVAL AT VENICE





In Memoriam

Dr. Henry Donald Campbell

About two o'clock on Tuesday afternoon, April 10, 1934, the sad news quietly spread over the campus that Dr. Henry Donald Campbell was dead. This word brought sorrow to the hearts of faculty and students alike.

By reason of his character and experience he fully merited the recognition that by common consent was given him as the senior member of the faculty. Constant in friendship, wise and prudent in counsel, stanchly upholding justice and right, warning against dangers, yet ever ready for progress, he was honored and loved by us all.

Born on the campus, whence he was gathered to his fathers, he probably more fully embodied the spirit and traditions of Washington and Lee than any other single individual who has ever been connected with the institution. With him closes a unique period of continuous service of eighty-two years in the same department of the University by two members of the same family. His father, John Lyle Campbell, was an honored professor of geology for thirty-five years, and Dr. Campbell himself, who succeeded his father, served for forty-seven years in the same professorship, and during twenty-six of these years he was also Dean of the University.

Resume

Under the tutelage of a new coach and a "New Deal" in Athletics, Head Coach "Tex" Tilson and his assistant, "Cy" Young, using a modified Warner system of play, led the Blue and White through one of the most successful seasons enjoyed in many years. The gridmen tackling one of the hardest schedules possible, emerged with a most creditable record; and the promises for a strong 1934 eleven are even brighter with a wealth of material coming up from the championship Yearling squad.

The Generals started off the season with their annual game with West Virginia's powerful Mountaineers. Outweighed twenty pounds to the man and doped to lose by several touchdowns, the Blue and White battled their opponents on even terms, and emerged from the field with a 0-0 deadlock—the first time a W. and L. eleven has tied the Mountaineers since 1927. Defensive work by Mattox and punting by Sawyers, featured the General's play.

The next Saturday, Tilson's gridmen defeated an unusually strong Roanoke College team, 14-6. The General forward wall threw the Maroon backs for a loss of 46 yards on running plays while the Blue and White gained 130 yards through the visitors' line. The William and Mary Indians next invaded Lexington and were defeated, 7-0; due chiefly to Sawyer's 54-yard return of a punt to place the ball in scoring position where Mattox scored from the 10-yard line. The feature of the Generals' offense was a drive from their 7 to the Indians' 10-yard stripe in nine plays.

Captain Bolen then led his team against Yale in New Haven and finally lost, 14-0, after a stiff battle against the Northerners. The Blue and White drove to Yale's 23-yard line in the first quarter, but lost the ball on a pass over the goal line. Yale began a determined drive in the second quarter and finally scored after gallant stand by the Generals, featuring Boland and Glynn's play. Yale's last tally resulted from a fumble by the General's safety; Yale recovering on 20-yard line and pushing over another score.

On October 21, the Generals met the strong, undefeated Kentucky eleven in Roanoke. Outweighed 18 pounds to the man, the Blue and White completely outplayed the Wildcats to upset their winning streak with a 7-0 victory. After a scoreless first half, the Generals received the kick-off and drove 94 yards for a touchdown, Sawyers scoring on a shuttle pass from the 10-yard line. The Generals outrushed the Wildcats 128 yards to 80 yards and bottled up, Kerchivial, their star back.

STATE CHAMPIONS

Coach Tilson next week led his gridmen to Princeton, to face the undefeated Tiger team and succeeded in holding them to the lowest score of the season, a 6-0 victory; but a heart-breaker to lose. Although W. and L. crossed Princeton's goal twice, once when Dyer intercepted a pass and another time when Sawyers scored, on the same play that beat Kentucky, after a drive to the Tiger 10-yard line, both were disallowed by the referee. Princeton was completely outplayed. The Generals rolled up 11 first downs to their 10; gained 147 yards to their 137; netted 78 yards on passes to their 28; and made no fumbles to their six.

On November 4, after a strain of the Yale, Kentucky, and Princeton games, the Generals opened their Big Four campaign by playing V. P. I. in Blacksburg which ended in a 7-7 deadlock. The offense was featured by Seaton's 63-yard return of a punt which put the ball in a scoring position where Mattox finally bucked it over and kicked the extra point. The Gobblers scored early in the first quarter on a pass over the goal. In fourth quarter, after an exchange of punts, V. P. I. drove to the Generals' 4-yard line with four downs for a score and at the end of the fourth down it was still four yards to go, featured by a determined stand by the Blue and White line.

Returning to Lexington for Homecoming and their last local appearance, the Generals whipped the Virginia Wahoos for the third straight year and cinched the state championship with a 6-0 victory. The Blue and White tally came in the last quarter when Joe Sawyers took a Wahoo punt on his 15-yard line and ran through the entire Virginia team for a score. The play of Captain Bolen was outstanding as well as the entire team.

The strenuous schedule which had been showing on the squad ever since the Princeton game when the Generals were at their peak, ripened into actuality the last two games when Centre defeated the Blue and White 12-0 in Danville for their homecoming; and Maryland crushed the Generals in their last game of the season at College Park, 33-13. Crippled with the loss of three regulars in the backfield, the defense was helpless against the Colonel passes which brought both their tallies. The Generals piled up 13 first downs to their 4, however. At College Park, with regulars still missing, the Blue and White jumped to an early 13-0 lead, but then cracked and Maryland ran across five touchdowns over a broken W. and L. team—the eleven that had beaten Kentucky and outplayed Princeton just couldn't keep form during the latter part of the grueling ten-game schedule. The season on a whole was successful, winning four, losing four and tying two over the outstanding teams of the East and state.



Resume

The Generals' chances of a good season were lessened by the ineligibility of Hemphorne, star guard of 1933 and Ellis, star freshman center of last year. Coach "Cy" Young molded his team around the veterans Captain Joe Sawyers, Smith, Fields, and Jones.

St. Johns was the first team played and defeated by a 38-28 margin on the local court. Virginia was next defeated in Lynchburg by a 26-25 count in a thrilling encounter—the lead changed five times during last half. Sawyers bagged the winning goal in last seconds of play. The Blue and White suffered their first defeat at the hands of the strong U. N. C. quint. Lagging 21-7 at the half, the Generals found themselves in the last period, scoring 17 points to Carolina's 13, but lost 34-24.

The next week saw the Generals invade North Carolina and after holding N. C. State to a 13-9 margin at half, finally lost 30-17. The next evening at Durham, in a close game, Duke finally nosed out a 41-37 victory in which the lead changed ten times during the game. Duke led at the half 22-20. Returning home and then journeying to Morgantown to play West Virginia, the Generals couldn't get going and dropped the encounter by a 41-27 score. Duke was next tackled in Lynchburg and after leading the Blue Devils in the first quarter and trailing 21-19 at half, the Durham quint pulled away for a 41-27 win.

Returning to Lexington, and strengthened by the return of Ellis to the squad, the Generals crushed V. P. L., 47-31. Smith, Pette, and Ellis led the offense. The next night William and Mary was defeated 44-27 by an improved General team. Journeying over to Blacksburg, the Gobblers were overwhelmed 48-30; featured by Charlie Smith scoring 15 points in 12 minutes in the last half.


The Red Terriors of N. C. State were the next victims, succumbing 43-47 in one of the best played games of the year in Doremus gym. Pette and Ellis each scored 12 points, while Sawyers held Rex, star visiting guard, to no field goals. Richmond was met later in the week and defeated 29-26 in a slow contest.

Virginia nosed out the Blue and White quint 31-30 in Charlottesville and George Washington edged out another close game by a 30-27 margin in Washington, when Coach Young rested the regulars for the tournament in Raleigh.

Southern Conference Tournament Won by Washington and Lee


RALEIGH, N. C.—MARCH 1, 2, 3

In the thirteenth annual tournament, South Carolina, the defending champions, were seeded first; North Carolina, second; Duke, third; and Maryland, fourth. The Generals drew the strong Maryland quint as their first round opponents and administered a 45-37 trouncing to place them in the semi-finals. The shooting and passing of the entire team was superb. Sawyers led the offense with 18 points which was the highest scored in any game during the tournament.

N. C. State pulled the upset by eliminating the championship South Carolina team and faced the Generals in the semi-finals. In a close game, the Blue and White defeated the Raleigh quint 32-28. The teamwork and passing of the entire team again featured for Coach Young's five. This victory placed the Generals in the finals against Duke who had upset North Carolina.

In a close and wonderfully exciting game, the Blue and White tossers came from behind in the last few seconds of play to win the contest and the Southern Conference Championship with a 30-29 victory to give a Virginia team its first court Championship since the Conference was established in 1921. With fourteen seconds remaining and Duke leading 20-28, Captain Joe Sawyers broke up a Duke pass, dribbled the length of the floor to miss a snowbird; Pette following up, batted in the winning goal as the whistle sounded ending the game with a 30-29 margin for Washington and Lee.

Coach Young and his squad are to be congratulated on their achievement in giving W. and L. their first Basketball title and their fighting spirit throughout the tournament. Although the loss of Captain Joe Sawyers will be keenly felt, the Generals' chances of repeating in 1935 are excellent, with a wealth of freshmen material from the Yearling championship quint.

The Generals won all their meets by overwhelming scores with the exception of a 16-16 deadlock with the Navy; and with an undefeated Yearling squad coming up, prospects look even better for next year.

WASHINGTON AND LEE, 31; JOHNS HOPKINS, 5

The General grapplers opened the season on the home mat by trouncing the visitors with the loss of only one match. Coach Mathis used six sophomores against the Hopkins team; falls were registered by: Crew, Shively, Pritchard and Seitz.

WASHINGTON AND LEE, 34; ROANOKE Y. M. C. A., 0

The Roanokers were easy victims for the Blue and White as Mathis used an entirely different team with the exception of Bonino in the unlimited class. Five falls were gained by the Generals.

WASHINGTON AND LEE, 30; DAVIDSON, 0

The next match saw the Davidson College team completely outclassed and blanked by the Generals on the local mat. DeVan, Seitz and Bonino gained falls.

WASHINGTON AND LEE, 29; N. C. U., 5

The Generals left for a North Carolina invasion, wrestling Carolina Friday and N. C. State on Saturday. Coach Mathis used five reserves against the Tar Heels, losing only one bout. Sarkis, Smith, Hodges and Bonino gained falls as the Blue and White easily defeated their opponents.

WASHINGTON AND LEE, 18; N. C. STATE, 6

Journeying over to Raleigh the next night, the matmen faced the undefeated Red Territors of State, winning six matches and losing only two. No falls were registered, due chiefly to the smallness of the mat.

WASHINGTON AND LEE, 16; NAVY, 16

The next week found the Generals at Annapolis tackling the undefeated Navy squad which proved to be a thrilling encounter. Trailing 16-11 with only one match to go, Bonino pinned his rival in quick order to tie up the match at 16-all. Pritchard, Smith and Crew were the other winners for the Blue and White.

The Generals returned home to end the season with an easy victory over the Gobblers from Blacksburg with the loss of one match, Seitz losing to Waldrop, their Conference champion in a tussle packed with thrills. Crew, DeVan and Bonino gained falls; Bonino throwing his rival in 40 seconds.

SOUTHERN CONFERENCE TOURNAMENT, HELD AT BLACKSBURG, VA.

The Generals successfully defended their championship by piling up a total of 31 points, V. M. I. trailing. Sarkis retained his 126-pound championship; Smith captured the 145-pound title and Bonino the unlimited. Crew, 118 pounds, was runner-up; Pritchard, runner-up in 165 pounds; Seitz, runner-up in 155-pound division; Sloan, third in 135-pound; and Hodges, third in 175-pound division.

Co-Captain Smith went through his fourth season, undefeated in dual meets—losing only once in 1933 in the finals of tournament by a 50-second time advantage in an over period. Co-Captain Pritchard, Conference champion in 1933, was undefeated in four years of wrestling, dual meets; losing only in finals of 1934 tournament in 165-pound class. Pritchard gained third place in the National Intercollegiates held at Ann Harbor, Mich. Bonino lost in the semi-finals in the unlimited division in the National Intercollegiates but won the cup offered by Coach Mathis for the highest point score of the year—winning all of his matches by falls.

In the last five years, the Varsity has won 28, tied 1 and lost 1—a record hardly surpassed by any team in the country.



BOXING RESUME, 1934

The season opened in the local ring against Roanoke College with the Generals pounding out a $6\frac{1}{2}$ - $\frac{1}{2}$ victory. Corbett, Davies, Moore, Captain Mincher, Jean, and Martin won for the Blue and White. Short was held to a draw and Mincher won by a K. O., the only one of the evening.

Tilson's mitmen next journeyed to Raleigh to take on the strong State squad, who defeated the Blue and White by a 6-2 margin. Short outpointed his opponent in the 165-pound class, and Martin and Moore fought their rivals to a draw. Captain Mincher was defeated by his old rival, Garner, in a close battle which was the rubber fight after three years of rivalry.

The next week the Generals fought the V.P.I. team in the most colorful contest of the season. The match was featured by Captain Mincher's knockout of Captain Bussey after $2\frac{1}{2}$ rounds of furious fighting. Davies, Reeser, Moore, Short and Martin were the other victors for the Blue and White. The heavyweight was forfeited to the visitors, giving the Generals a 6-2 margin.

Maryland was the next meet, and in a close battle the Generals emerged victors when Martin knocked out his opponent in the light-heavy class. Corbett also k-oed his rival. Mincher got a forfeit; Short gained a decision; and Davies and his opponent fought to a draw as the Blue and White were victors by a $4\frac{1}{2}$ - $3\frac{1}{2}$ count.

The General mitmen entered the Southern Conference Tournament held at Charlottesville the next week, which was featured by Martin's advance to the finals when he lost a decision to his Maryland opponent, whom he had previously k-oed and Moore's decision over Clemson's Captain.

The Blue and White closed the season with a journey to Annapolis to tackle the strong Navy team. Forfeiting to the Midshipmen in the 118 and unlimited weights, due to injuries, the Generals won two, lost three, and a draw in the remaining six matches. Davies and Martin were the victors, while Short and his opponent fought to a draw to make the final count $5\frac{1}{2}$ - $2\frac{1}{2}$ in favor of the Navy.

Martin and Short were undefeated in dual meets during the season.




