ZBT Class of 1959 Makes a Leadership Gift to the Hillel House -

50th reunions are a time to leave your mark on a place. The ZBT class of 1959 is ready to do just that. Their big anniversary is coming up in spring of 2009, and the brothers wanted to mark the occasion by doing something that would make a difference at W&L.

The '59 ZBTs were inspired by W&L's plans to build a facility for Hillel. They knew that it was important for the University in recruiting Jewish students, so a core of interested members of the class worked tirelessly to discuss what they and their classmates might do. The group included Steve Marks, Ralph Evans, Don Sigmund, Steve Friedlander, and Ed Levy. The result of those efforts today is \$1.1 million, including an endowment for long term maintenance. This wonderful leadership gift has brought us more than three fourths of the way towards our fundraising goal of \$4 million.

Thanks to the '59 ZBTs, we are within sight of breaking ground by September 2009.

In this issue of The Star, we recognize and thank the great guys in the ZBT class of '59. These alumni are helping to shape an exciting vision of Jewish community life at W&L. We are grateful for their support, and we hope that, like us, you will be inspired and entertained by their reflections.

An emeritus member of the W&L Board of Trustees, Steve Marks is a private investor in Houston, Texas. He believes that it is important to support the W&L Hillel House "because it will in part, fulfill the 'hole' left when the two Jewish fraternities left campus." He believes that the new facility "will provide a place for Jewish students to meet, socialize, and identify with their heritage."

Donald W. Sigmund, an avid Redskins fan, started in the insurance business in 1964, and is currently associated with The Meltzer Group in Washington DC. He believes that the new facility "will enrich all aspects of campus life for generations to come." He hopes that the Hillel House will be a "vibrant, exciting addition to the cultural life of the university."

"My generosity in part, has to do with my 50th reunion, but mostly it is in honor of my lifelong fraternity friends and in memory of those who are gone," said Ralph Evans, who is retired from the NY Stock Exchange. He is pleased that the Hillel House project crossed his path this year.

Childress Challenge Grant

Don Childress, the Rector of the Board of Trustees, has been an advocate for the Washington and Lee Hillel House from the beginning. He strongly supports the goal of enrolling more Jewish students at W&L and realizes that the Hillel House is crucial to achieving the goal. Now, as part of his commitment to W&L's new campaign, Don Childress has committed a \$500,000 matching challenge grant. Knowing that we need to raise \$1.5 million to complete successfully our \$4 million goal for the Hillel House, beginning September 24, 2008, Don Childress will give \$1 up to \$500,000 for every \$2 in new gifts and pledges contributed to the Hillel House. The Rector desires that we meet his challenge in gifts and pledges by the early part of 2009 so that we can begin construction of the Hillel House in the summer of 2009.

W&L Hillel Invited to Join Seven-College Initiative

Washington and Lee is among a group of seven national liberals arts colleges included in a pilot initiative being undertaken by Hillel: The Foundation for Jewish Campus Life, the largest Jewish campus organization in the world, to enhance the experience for Jewish students on smaller campuses.

Joan Robins, the director of Washington and Lee Hillel, attended a training seminar in October as part of the initiative.


"The first training seminar offered a wonderful opportunity to meetcolleagues and exchange ideas," said Robins. "While I am familiar with Hillel's mission and values, it was helpful to discuss ways to apply these values to my work with students. The goal is to enrich the lives of Jewish students on campus. I am already feeling the support from the cohort: W&L is going to be able to send four students on the birthright Israel program this winter."

The other colleges in the pilot cohort are Bowdoin College, Colgate University, Franklin and Marshall College, Lehigh University, Middlebury College, and Williams College. The campuses were selected on the basis of having one paid professional dedicated to Jewish life on campus, high alumni involvement, an open relationship with Hillel, and high academic rankings.

According to Deb Geiger, Hillel International's Assistant Director of the Soref Initiative for Emerging Campuses, the goal is to increase student engagement and to double the number of Jewish students who participate in immersion experiences such as Alternative Break and Taglit-Birthright Israel.

"There is tremendous potential to develop the Jewish student populations on these campuses by applying a more strategic and focused effort," explained Geiger. "We want to ensure that despite the small population, Jewish students feel engaged in Jewish life and have access to the same opportunities, like Taglit-Birthright Israel, as do campuses with large Jewish student populations."

Hillel has committed to the seven-institution cohort for two years and will not only work to get students in more meaningful Jewish experience on and off campus but also to provide the professional with more skills, knowledge and resources.

For many years Jerry has been active in the Memphis Jewish community, serving on many boards, including the Federation which funds Hillel at the University of Memphis. "It has been extremely gratifying to observe and measure how Hillel has enriched the college experience of Jewish students on that campus. I can only hope that W&L does as well."

Tony Frank retired in February, 2004 from RBC Dain Rauscher, after 44 years in the investment business. Like his classmates, Tony believes that W&L would greatly benefit from a tangible presence of Jewish life on campus.

Arnold Steiner, retired from the banking business, is living in Birmingham. He is pleased that the Hillel House will allow Jewish students to have a place to celebrate holidays on campus, rather than have to travel out of town.

We eagerly anticipate groundbreaking day, and thank all those who are helping to bring this vision to life.
