

Hampton Nov 16, 1903

Dear Alck-

I recd yours of the 9th inst. and as I could not give you full information in regard to Uncle Amey's, I immediately wrote to Belle Weston to furnish, one with what she knew concerning their births & deaths. So far I have heard nothing from her. Possibly she supposed I intended that she should give you directly this information. Our Grand Father Guy was named Robert. I am the 4th Robert in the Guy family - my Grand mother's name was Mary Glendy. My father was born March 1792. so I presume whole you might have been about 2 years younger. I think our Grand Parents were born & lived near Co. Derry Ireland & had the children were born. As Robt Glendy's father was named Amey he was married to Amey by first wife Mrs. David, John & Mary. by the second wife, Robt Amey son of Amey I don't remember. I have an excellent likeness painted of the Rev. Dr. John Glendy, Col. Jas. Keenan who once lived on the old Joe Smith farm found in the Garret a sermon in pamphlet form of Dr. Glendy's preached at Gungling Spring on the occasion of the death of Gen. Washington. I intended to send it to Richmond for the Society

of Antiquities" but mislaid it some where
and have not been able to lay my hands upon
it since.
