William Willson, postmaster, merchant and treasurer of Washington College, built his classical revival home in 1820. The building remained a residence until 1911 when Harry Walker converted it into a meat market and grocery store. Located in the downtown historic district, today it is Lexington's most distinctive restaurant decorated with period antiques and offering dishes prepared with the freshest and finest local and regional ingredients along with assortment of American wines. The Willson-Walker House proudly greets its guests with the same warm welcome that Capt. Willson would have extended over 160 years ago.
