

# Report of School Board to League

## Result of Interview Favorable

The result accomplished by the work of the Home and School League has been far reaching and worthy of all the time taken and trouble incurred.

The following points have been conceded by the Board: (1) One year constitute the work of the first and second grade each where before it took two years each, (2) Sunday School Lessons which were taught in the upper classes but the Principals have been struck out. This was absolutely out of place, depriving the Church of its work, (3) The Public School Building is granted to the League as the permanent place of its meetings.

The points yet under consideration, are: (1) the granting of a nine month school year, and (2) allotting seven years to do the work of a complete elementary course instead of ten as before.

Now to those who contended for for these things: it is rather encouraging, but to those who considered

our efforts vain and foolish will see the result in the same light unless he is willing to endorse our contentions at the eleventh hour. It is better late to confess than never, and to do so make one free.

The League is open to membership on the first and third Monday night in each month. It implores each and every one to avail yourself of the opportunity to join and work some good to the community about you.

For more than a half century our preachers have been filling our bodies with a dying religion. Now let us pray that the next half will be a living religion.

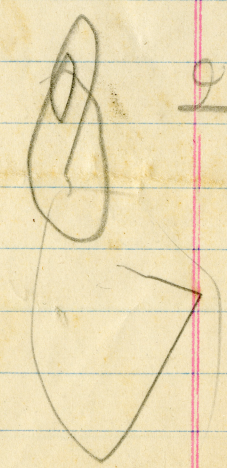
There is no better evidence that we are going to get some religion to live by than the fact that
