Resolution of the Lexington School Board April 9, 1923.

" A communication having been received from the Home & School League of the Colored People of Lexington, the clerk of the Board is hereby directed to return said paper to said League, stating that ^{it} is necessary that any paper which the said League desires to place before the School Board should be signed by the president and secretary (or clerk as the case may be) of the said League. And that, **if** said League desires to prefer charges against the present teachers of the colored school or any of them, they set out said charges clearly and distinctly in writing in their communication, numbering them one, two, three, etc."

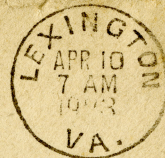
