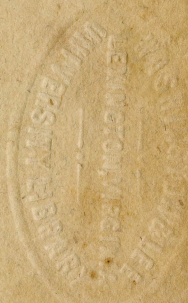

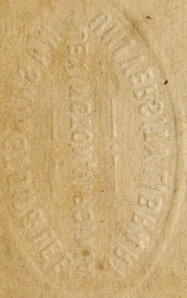

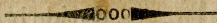

NOTE.—Those who are marked *irregular*, are either such as do not intend to take the full Course of Studies ; or such as have entered College with an anomalous preparation, and cannot yet be regularly classed. The want of system in the preparatory schools, causes many to enter College thus *irregularly*, to the inconvenience of all parties. It requires in some cases a year or more to bring up the deficient Studies, and qualify the Student for regular standing, according to the Course of Studies prescribed to each Class. If masters of preparatory schools would aim to qualify their pupils regularly for a particular Class in College, the inconveniences and disadvantages here noticed, would soon be obviated.

## FRESHMAN CLASS.

FIRST SESSION.—*First Recitation.*—Xenophon and Cicero, Ancient Geography. *Second Recitation.*—Arithmetic and Algebra.

SECOND SESSION.—*First Recitation.*—Livy, Tacitus, Roman Antiquities. *Second Recitation.*—Geography.

## SOPHOMORE CLASS.

FIRST SESSION.—*First Recitation.*—Select Parts of Blair's Lectures, Murray's Large English Grammar, and part of Playfair's Euclid. *Second Recitation.*—Græca Majora, Greek Antiquities.

SECOND SESSION.—*First Recitation.*—Rest of Euclid, including Supplements, Plane Trigonometry, Surveying. *Second Recitation.*—Prosody, Horace.

## JUNIOR CLASS.

FIRST SESSION.—*First Recitation.*—Natural Philosophy. *Second Recitation.*—Græca Majora, Greek Prosody.

SECOND SESSION.—*First Recitation.*—Conick Sections, Astronomy, Globes, General Principles of Chemistry.—*Second Recitation.* Remainder of Græca Majora.

## SENIOR CLASS.

FIRST SESSION.—*First Recitation.*—Rhetoric, Criticism, Logic. *Second Recitation.*—Review.

**SECOND SESSION.—First Recitation.—Moral and Political Philosophy. Second Recitation.—Review.**

The Faculty may modify the order of Studies so far as they may think necessary, and report such modification to the Board of Trustees for their approbation.

Each Class is required to recite twice a day, except on Saturdays, when they will be required to recite once in the forenoon.

The Freshman Class will be required to speak short extracts once in four weeks—The Sophomore Class, longer pieces—and the Junior Class pieces of their own composition. The Senior Class will be required to produce, at the end of each Session, an essay on some prescribed subject, and to deliver each an original Speech.

The Freshman, Sophomore and Junior Classes, to be employed on Sundays, in the Study of the Scriptures; the Senior Class to be employed, on Sundays, in Studying the Evidences of Christianity.

The Sessions begin on the third Wednesdays of May and November, and end on the third Wednesdays of April and October. The Annual Commencement is at the close of the Winter Session. New Students do best, therefore, to enter College in May, when the annual course of studies is begun by each Class.

The necessary expences of a Student for one year, exclusive of clothing, books, and contingencies, are as follows :—

Diet, 38 dollars per Session	\$76 00
Tuition, 15 do. per Session Room Rent, 2 do. deposit, 3 do.	40 00
Bed hire, 8 do. per annum, Washing, 10 do. Fire & Candles 7 do.	25 00

Total for one year, \$141 00

**NOTE.**—The deposit of three dollars per Session is intended to secure indemnification for any injury done to the College Buildings, &c. Whatever is not required for these purposes, is restored to the Students at the end of each Session.

The College fees are required each Session in advance; payment for diet, which is had in genteel private families, is generally expected in advance.
