I received your letter this morning & will reply in time for the mail to day, though not exactly in the humor for writing as Jackson's part of the army has had a blow up. When we left Romney Jackson as I told you in my last left Louis' force there & brought his old brigade to Winchester, when Loring, without consulting any thing to Jackson, sent three of his brigadiers to Richmond & had Jackson's order countermanded & his <sup>Loring's</sup> orders ordered back to Winchester by order of Sec of War (Beaupreman) in consequence of which Gen Jackson has resigned & his men swear that they will not serve under Loring which the consequence will be I can not tell. But if the orders of such a man as Jackson are to be disregarded by such trifling pupies as Loring & seconded by Beaupreman I

With the Southern Confederacy is  
in a hard fix. But enough about  
that, I guess you will move in  
a day or so for I never said we were  
an satisfied set of men. For the Stone  
Wall just now I hear that Long's  
men are just as much attached  
to him & we are to ours, so would  
not be surprised to hear of a bust of  
ours. In regard to my uniform  
& my congratulating myself that I  
was so well off, but you seem to  
think that it is rather dilapidated  
the only thing that I ~~had~~ need is  
a cap I will have my books packed  
up and can do very well. We will  
go into a house Monday which has  
six rooms in it so you see I will not  
be crowded. What a good thing it is  
to be at head quarters! but how long  
we will be here I do not know, Gen  
Jackson still keeps us

As we are the only soldiers quartered  
in town, we get along finely, especially  
among the ladies, who think that their  
is nothing equal to the S.H.W's or a  
we are here called Jackson's body-  
guard. I got a letter from Mr  
Hutton this morning in which Colli-  
wood letter was enclosed, how glad I was to  
see again that handwriting!
