Dear Sister.

I rec'd your letter dated the 17th July a
day or two ago & would have answered immediately but
as there was a prospect of going South myself I postponed
it until it was decided who should go & as I am
not among the fortunate ones I will now write.

I am greatly relieved at hearing of the welfare
of you all. I feared it might be otherwise.
Since my last letter Cousin Billy has been to see
me, he was very kind & is every thing that we could
wish. Sends his love to you all. Ellie is well but
tell is not in good health, has had quite a severe
spell of sickness (Typhoid Fever) his life was for
several days despaired of, but he has gotten
a great deal better. I have been very well re-
-lieved & am as comfortable as circumstances will
permit. I requested Uncle Doyle, who left here
with the downward-bound prisoners, to write
to you all. He was in my mess whilst here.

Uncle Doyle is quite well. If you have an opportunity
let Mrs Hollins know that her son who was a
member of our co is here & well.

Give my love to all friends. Hoping
to be able soon to see you all again I am -
